
Making a Difference | Legacy Impact

Leaving a legacy gift is an opportunity for you to make a real and lasting difference to future generations, to make a sustainable impact on St. Patricks College. Your support will ensure that students receive the best training and education in an environment that promotes positive learning and equips and empowers them to transform tomorrow and be the change called for in parishes and communities across the country.

All legacy gifts, irrespective of size, are held in the highest regard. Your legacy can directly enable our three key development areas. Strengthening each will enable St. Patrick's College to remain a beacon for the Catholic faith, a valued national resource and a global repository of theological knowledge:

- To invest in our people and secure and retain world-class academics
- 2 To grow our scholarships to support the Catholic leaders of tomorrow
- 3 To maintain and improve our campus to preserve our rich heritage and embrace a new future

The Transforming Tomorrow movement is our opportunity to prepare the next generation for service. It is ambitious, confident and forward thinking. Types of Legacy Giving

We are hugely thankful to all those who have included a bequest to St. Patrick's College in their will, cementing a solid foundation for future generations of the faithful. If you would like to remember us in your will, there are a number of different options which can be tailored to your specific needs.

- A Pecuniary Gift is generally the simplest form of legacy. It allows you to leave a specific sum of money to St. Patrick's College. The gift can be a defined figure that does not change with time, or you may instruct your trustees to take account of the impact of inflation.
- A Gift of an Asset is in relation to physical property. This type of donation is deemed to be at the price originally paid, creating no tax liability for the donor. However, the value to St. Patrick's College would be the market value of the property. St. Patrick's may even sell the property without tax liability as long as any proceeds are used for the approved charitable purposes of the organisation.
- A Residuary Legacy relates to leaving St. Patrick's College a gift of the residue (or a share of the residue) of the estate. Residue is whatever is left after all debts, funeral expenses, certain other costs and tax and any other legacies have been deducted.
- A Reversionary Legacy enables you to pass your estate, or specific assets of your estate, to named individuals who will benefit throughout their lifetime. Following their deaths all, or some, of the estate is then passed to the beneficiaries as specified in the reversionary legacy.

Legacy Guidance from St. Patrick's College

A legacy can be made either by Will or by Codicil and we would be delighted to provide a suggested wording to ensure that a gift can be efficiently donated to St. Patrick's College. We do, however, recommend that you always consult your solicitor who will be able to advise you in light of your own particular circumstances.

If you do choose to remember the College, and would like to assign your legacy to a specific purpose – our Scholarships, our Campus or our People, or indeed to honour or commemorate a named individual, please discuss your intentions with us in confidence. Alternatively, you may wish to simply leave a general purpose legacy to be spent at the College's discretion. Legacies for general development enable us to respond quickly and effectively to new unexpected needs.

Enhancing Today, Transforming Tomorrow

Since 1795, over 11,000 seminarians have been prepared for ordination to the priesthood and thousands of lay students have gone on from here to work as Religious Educators, Catechists, Pastoral Assistants, Philosophers and Theologians.



- We will give you the opportunity to be connected with the College and to see the power of philanthropy at work.
- At any time in the future, you have the absolute right to change your mind about a gift to St Patrick's College made in your will.

Honorary Gifts are also a wonderful way to celebrate or pay tribute to a living person, to celebrate a special occasion or achievement, or merely acknowledge the honoree's importance in your life. Any gift may be designated an honorary gift.

In Memoriam Gifts Giving a gift in memory is a very special way to remember a loved one and acknowledge the importance of their faith in their life. It honours their memory while also allowing others the opportunity to benefit from the gift.
