Admission to this course is through CAO system (MU004).

For entry to the course a pass grade is required in five subjects of the Leaving Certificate or its equivalent.

Programme Delivery

The programme comes in two modes: (i) As a **three year full-time degree** - 180 credits. (ii) As a **one year top up** on philosophical study already undertaken at the undergraduate level. In particular the following pathways apply: Completion of the Higher Diploma in Philosophy or Diploma in Philosophy; Completion of a primary award in Philosophy alone or as a cognate subject (minimum of 50%)
